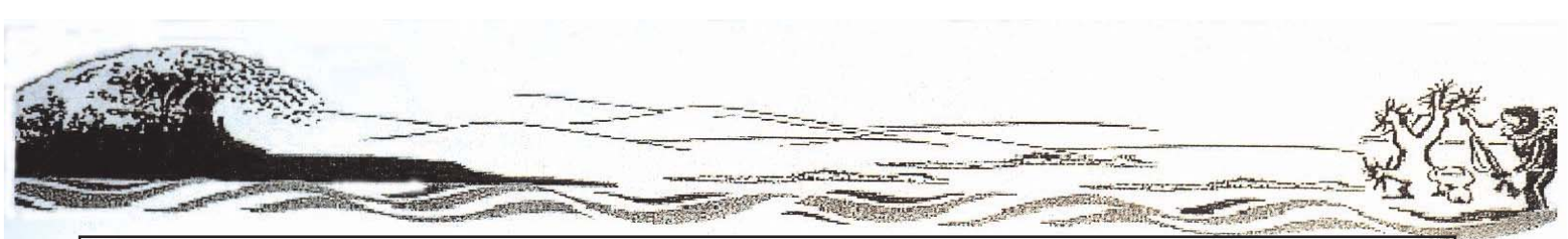

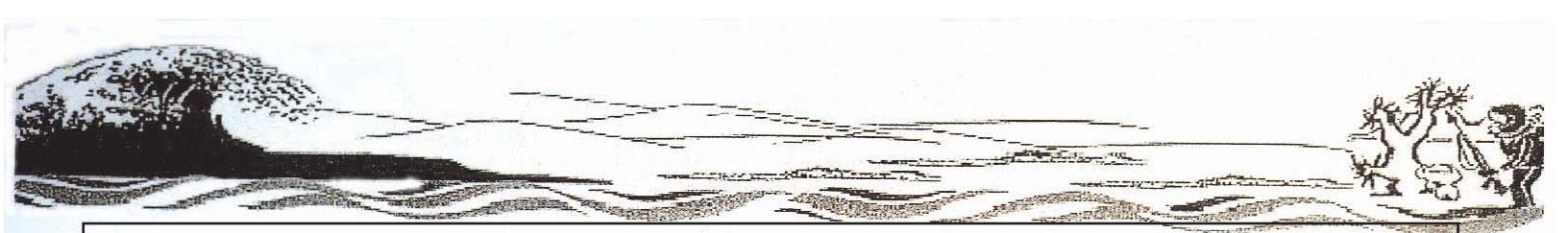

KEN KURTIS

Ken got certified in 1978 as part of a radio station promotion to set a Guinness record for underwater broadcasting. He became a NAUI Instructor in 1980 and has taught thousands of people over the years. He's logged close to 5000 dives, still actively teaches everything from entry-level on up, and confesses his favorite class to teach is Fish Identification. Ken leads our foreign trips (Sea of Cortez, Yap, Palau, Bonaire, Midway Island, Fiji, Maldives, Papua New Guinea, Cayman, and the Bahamas are just a few of the stamps in his passport) as well as diving on most of our local charters. He's served as chairman of Chamber Day/Eve since the early 90s and has served since 2003 as a Forensic Consultant to the LA County Coroner for scuba fatalities. Ken's been a volunteer Diver/Team Leader at the Aquarium of the Pacific in Long Beach since 1998, shoots photos and writes for local and national scuba publications, and is a familiar face to television viewers in Los Angeles. Ken's also hosted various TV shows, commercials, and infomercials (no, he can't get you a deal on the frying pan) that have run nationally and internationally. Ken claims to hold the Reef Seekers deep diving record of 3500' . . . but we have to add the caveat that he did it in the Alvin submersible for a PBS special so that might be cheating.

Ken's talk with go over his duties with the Coroner, explain some of the common problems that are seen, and give some useful information about how you can avoid being the next statistic.

We Wrap Our Sushi In It. What Is It?

We all know what Giant Kelp is. Some of us know the difference between Bull Kelp and Feather Boa Kelp, but do we know how to recognize Elk Kelp? How many of us know the details? We have all seen McMillan's Coralline Red Algae. If you think you haven't, then you haven't been diving in Southern California's waters. It surrounds us on our dives, but most don't even recognize it, pay attention to it, or realize how pervasive its presence is in our local waters.

How much do we really know about the seaweeds of the Pacific Coast?

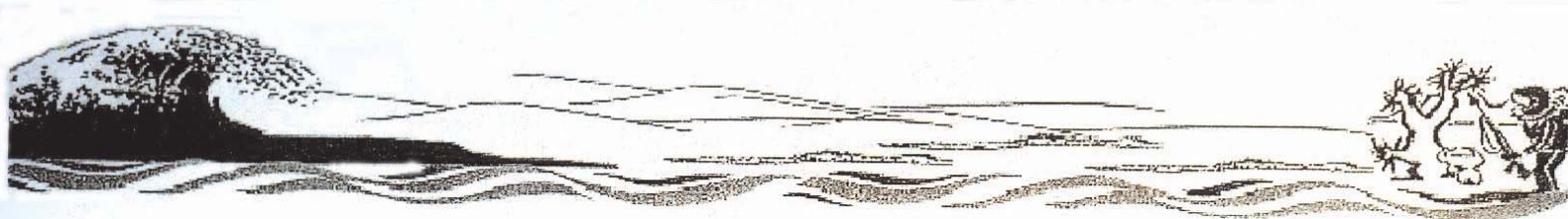
This wonderful book will teach you more about seaweed than you really need to know, but I guarantee that you will find it fascinating. From collecting seaweed for your kitchen while wading through the tidal pools of the intertidal region to scuba diving among the layers of Laminaria at 140 feet, you will find this book useful.

The editorial reviews say, "Created for those who work and play on the shores and in the shallow subtidal of the Pacific, this easy-to-use field guide is suitable for amateurs and professionals alike. Featuring a "quick key" and filled with interesting details, this comprehensive book will enable you to readily identify 128 species of marine algae commonly found along the coast from Alaska to Baja California.. Each species is accompanied by at least one color photograph, and text that covers identifying characteristics, range, and habit. It contains 138 color photographs, 14 line drawings that illustrate algal structures and life cycles, 3 easy-to-use keys to help sort and identify specimens and 9 recipes for cooking with seaweed."

RISING TIDES Brian and Claudia

Club Members Brian Basura and Claudia Richardson, aboard their sailing vessel Skylight, are well underway in the Pacific. They left the Southern most tip of Baja on our about the 14th of April. As of the 24th they had logged 1000 nautical miles towards their destination, Hiva Oa in the Marquesas. They seem to be doing fine with very light to moderate winds, rolling seas and some light squalls. They report seeing sea turtles, a LOT of flying fish, booby birds and dolphins. (It seems that Skylight scares the flying fish up out of the water. The booby birds are following them in order to eat the flying fish. The birds are even trying to roost on the mast, which was kinda cute until Brian and Claudia saw how much poop a booby bird could produce.) They are in contact with other boats via ham radio and feel secure knowing assistance is within 200 nm.
